Culturally-responsive dissemination is an iterative, ongoing process inclusive of and driven by communities most affected by the issues the research is addressing.



Develop a dissemination plan and supporting budget at the design phase of the project for maximum impact. A close review of the budget process by all research partners is a means of increasing equity and remediating power differentials.



The means of evaluation and dissemination reflect researchers' understanding of the communities they engage with. Knowing the community means knowing the appropriate means of evaluation and dissemination and securing the resources needed for implementation.



The ability of community partners and stakeholders to leverage findings during and after the research project is a key measure of successful dissemination.

“ On Relationship-Building

“Relationship-building is key, but if you have weak relationships, everything else will go downhill; ultimately, we're talking about trust-building. Evaluation and dissemination will grow out of your relationship with the community.”

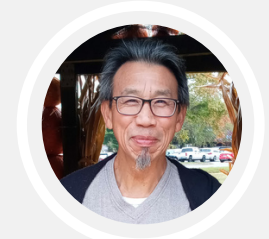
